REGISTRATION

A child must be registered latest by the end of November, if admission is sought for in April of the following year, on the enclosed registration form. The Common Aptitude Assessment (CAA) is held in the third week of January. The academic session begins in the month of April. Registration in no way ensures admission of the child, it is subject to clearing the Common Aptitude Assessment (CAA). Only registered candidates will be considered for CAA.

ADMISSION

After Registration candidates will be notified the date of Common Aptitude Assessment (CAA) and an interaction of the child along with his/her parents with the Principal. As the medium of instruction is English, an understanding of English as well as an English speaking skill is a must for all applicants. Candidates qualifying in the Common Aptitude Assessment will be granted admission, subject to the availability of seats. No admission is granted unless all the requirements are fulfilled. The Admission Committee reserves the right to admit the candidates based on their performance in the Common Aptitude Assessment, interviews, personality, intelligence and other capabilities. The decision of the Admission Committee will be final and binding in all cases. If a candidate fails to appear in the CAA/interview, his/her registration will lapse and the registration fee will be forfeited. However, the admission committee may consider, if justified.

Once the candidate is granted admission, he/she is required to fulfill all the formalities and pay the necessary fees within 15 days. If he/she fails to do so, the school is free to offer the seat to the next eligible candidate. Every child is required to submit a fitness certificate by an MBBS doctor.

The school, however reserves the right to decide the class in which a child may be placed on admission. The Principal does not bind himself/ herself to furnish any reason for the rejection of any application for admission. A child joining from any other school must carry his/her Transfer Certificate from the previous school accompanied by a Birth Certificate from the Municipality/committee authorities. The date of birth as declared at the time of admission cannot be altered later in the school records.

The minimum age of admission in L.K.G. is 4 years as on 1st April.

Note: At the time of going to press, June 2024, the information given is accurate but is liable to change. This is not a legal document, hence any information or claims herein are not subject to legal jurisdiction. Disputes are subject to Dehradun courts only.



SCHOOL UNIFORM

School Uniforms will be out sourced as per the measurement of the child on actual cost. On being granted admission, new students are sent a list, detailing the articles to be brought to the school by each child. Parents must ensure that exact number of articles required are sent with the child. The school has the right to confiscate any article which is not mentioned in the list. Any article which is confiscated will not be returned. We encourage a sense of equality and parents are advised not to send any expensive personal items to school with their children since the school will not, under any circumstance take responsibility for the loss of such items.

SCHOOL TERMS

There are two school terms each year, from April to September and October to March. A child joining or leaving in the middle of a year has to pay the fees for the whole academic session.

LAST DATE OF DEPOSITING FEES

Fee is to be paid in full by 12th February for the summer term and by 12th August for the winter term of each year. There will be a penal charge of Rs. 200/- per day for the defaulters. Undue delay in the payment of the fee could lead to the child's name being struck off the rolls, at the discretion of the Principal.

DAY SCHOLARS/DAY BOARDERS

Fees is to be paid as per the bill by 30th March for the 1st term (April-June) 30th June for IInd term (July-September). 30th September for IIIrd term (October-December) & 30th December for the IVth term (January-March). There will be penal charge of Rs. 100/- per day in case the dates, of depositing the fees, are not adhered to.

WITHDRAWALS

Parents withdrawing their child in the middle of a Term will not be entitled to any refund of fee. Parents who decide to discontinue the education of a child from the next term must give 3 month's prior notice in writing to the Principal, failing which, the security deposit & fees will be forfeited.

NRI's

The school invites admission to the children of Non-Resident Indians ensuring they live and learn in an atmosphere rich in the culture and values of the land. These formative school years inculcate ethics and codes handed down to us from our fore fathers / ancestors.

DISPUTES

Any disputes and/or claims of any nature whatsoever, will be subject to the jurisdiction of the Dehradun court only. This prospectus is not in any way a document of the school, rules/regulations etc. The school reserves the right to change/delete or revise any information given in this document at any time without giving any prior notice. (It only serves to outline the school's aims and objectives functioning and general rules and regulations.)





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GENERAL INFORMATION

WHY CO-EDUCATION?

It is a more natural environment to grow in and also affords siblings equal opportunity for quality education in the same school.

WHY RESIDENTIAL SCHOOL?

It offers the child an opportunity to grow and bloom as an individual and a confident person with a well groomed personality, who makes his own mark without bringing into consideration the parent's economic and social status.

RULES

Any child found habitually stealing, cheating, in possession of illegal tuck, cash or forbidden items, deliberate and persistent absence from classes, prep, games, hobbies and activities, breaking school property, telling lies, rude and disobedient, not punctual, disturbing teachers or classmates during class or prep, using improper language, late after an outing or vacations, or showing any other display of bad conduct will be liable to punishment.

Deliberate disobedience and display of bad conduct will be punishable by means of issuing a Yellow Card, Red Card or Blue Card in the morning school assembly.

A Yellow Card received means warning, a chance to improve.

A Yellow Card received second time means last warning before suspension.

A Red Card received means suspension for 3 to 7 days as the case may be.

A Red Card received for the second time means expulsion. If a child is expelled and the fees has already been paid will be forfeited. No dialogue will be entertained in this regard. The Principal's decision will be final and binding.

A Blue Card received means he/she needs to work hard and improve a lot in academics in order to be promoted to the next class.

Students are expected to follow a high moral code of conduct. The school renders adequate guidance and counseling towards following good behavior and high ethical life. If any student break rules or indulges in anti social activities he/she will be liable to disciplinary action and expulsion from the school.

If a child is found in possession of a mobile phone will be immediately expelled from school and the parents will be called for. Re admission fees has to be deposited in case the child wishes to continue in the institution.

TELEPHONE CALLS AND LETTER WRITING

Each student is given a chance to call his/her parents from his/her registered telephone code for fifteen minutes on a scheduled day in a week. Students are encouraged to write letters and parents are requested to reciprocate by writing to them regularly.





GENERAL RULES

ACHIEVEMENTS AND AWARDS

- 1. Aryan Spirit Trophy is for Good conduct. This is awarded to a child, who is kind and generous and has shown good conduct in every sphere during his/her stay in the institution.
- 2. Student of The Year is for the best student. This is awarded to a child who has excelled in academics and displayed high level of discipline in the institution by dint of his/her extraordinary good behaviour, following school rules at all times and has shown a sense of belongingness to the institution.
- 3. The Aryan Star Trophy is for all round excellence. This prestigious trophy is awarded to a child who the Principal chooses for displaying excellence in all three areas of achievement, i.e. academics, games/sports and co-curricular activities.

CERTIFICATE OF MERIT/EXCELLENCE

- 1. Certificate of Merit/Excellence is awarded for academics/games activities/cocurricular activities/good conduct.
- 2. An Academic proficiency Certificate is awarded for excellent academic results.
- 3. A "Games Achievement Certificate" is awarded to a child who has done outstandingly well in a particular game.
- 4. A sports blazer is awarded to a student who is an all rounder in sports.

Criteria for promotion to the next class, under normal circumstances is that a child must not fail in any subject. The pass percentage is 50%. There will be 2 assessments and two examinations in the academic session. A student must pass at the average with 50% or above in each subject.

- 1. A child must score 50% and above in each subject to earn a promotion from class IX to X and XI to XII.
- 2. If a child is absent on the first or the last day of school or for 3 days without any information his name may be automatically struck off the rolls.
- 3. No boarder is permitted to change his / her status and become a Day Scholar from a Day Boarder. A request of this kind is not entertained at all.

RULES FOR VISITORS AND OUTINGS

- 1. Visitors list must be filled in duplicate by the parents, with great care and thought. Changes if any must be intimated in writing to the Principal.
- 2. No staff member, whether matron or teaching staff is permitted to be the local guardian of a student, except in the case of close relationship or old and genuine friendship.





- 3. Only local guardians or parents are allowed to take the child for an outing. No other person is allowed.
- 4. Recent photograph of parent and Local guardian is to be mandatorily submitted to the school office.
- 5. Students are not permitted to go on an outing with their friends/parent of a friend. However registered local guardian can take the student for an outing.

VISITING RULES

- (a) Persons whose names and photos are on the visitors list will only be permitted to meet and take the child out. Children will be allowed to go out only on scheduled outing days.
- (b) Strictly no visitors are allowed inside the dorms.
- (c) If a parent comes from out of town or any other day he/she may take prior permission from the Principal to meet the child for 15 minutes. No child is permitted to miss activities/games in order to meet parents/local guardian.
- (d) Visitors are requested to park their cars outside the gate. After entering the school premises, they must first meet the staff on-duty or the receptionist. No visitor is allowed to meet any child without the prior permission of the Principal.

APPLICATION/LETTER OF PERMISSION FOR OUTINGS AND MEETING BY E-MAIL.

- a. Must be received at least 24 hours in advance.
- b. Must be hand written and legibly signed (if in writing).
 - Any parent/guardian whose application for outing has not been received in advance, will have to take the Principal's permission before the child is allowed to go out.

DAY OUTING

- a. A boarder can have Sunday outings according to the school calendar and no other outing is allowed in lieu of the scheduled outing if not availed.
- b. No child is permitted to go out on the first and last Sunday of the term and also close to tests and examination.
- c. Day outings are from 9:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M. If a child is late in coming back from an outing the Principal has the authority to deprive him/her of one or more of his/her remaining outings. Night outings are not allowed.
- d. All boys/girls going out in the town must be in correct school uniform and must return as such. Changing to home clothes is strictly prohibited.

LATE RETURN

Students returning late from vacations, outings and leave are liable to a fine of Rs. 500/- per day and after 3 days the name will be struck off the rolls, a Readmission



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charge is to be paid in case the child is willing to continue his/her education.

If the reason for the delay is a medical one, parents must bring the child back personally with all supporting medical certificates and meet the Principal. Unless a clearance is received from our school doctor, the child will not be allowed to rejoin school.

WEDDINGS AND CELEBRATIONS

Strictly no permission is granted during the term for a child to attend a relative's wedding, other than that of a real sister or brother. In case of a real sister's or brother's wedding a student is allowed to leave only for three working days, but not during examinations and assessments. It is suggested therefore that parents try and fix wedding dates during the holidays.

ASSESSMENT OR EVALUATION

The school believes in all round development of the child, and does not advocate a highly pressurized, stress filled result oriented system of education. However, at the same time, it is imperative to develop a competitive spirit in the child to face the challenges of the modern world. For this, regular assessments and evaluations are an important medium to check the progress of the students. This helps the teachers to find out the weak areas and also direct their energies towards fruitful endeavor. Monthly tests and periodic examinations are held to assess the child's ability and academic excellence.

THE FACULTY

Teachers are the most important catalysts in the development of a child's personality and character. Spending their time and energy with the children, they influence and guide the child in becoming a strong and good human being. A highly qualified and experienced team at The Aryan School provides an innovative educational input. All our teachers are selected personally by a senior board, comprising veteran educationists. Special stress is given to their level of communication in English, and their teaching skills along with a value based personality. Our teachers are not just highly competent in their academic areas but good-natured, open-minded individuals with strong communication abilities, and act as role models for the children. They are sent for workshops and orientation programmes on regular basis to stay abreast with the latest trends in education.

MEDICAL FACILITIES

Basic and emergency medical facilities are available on the campus to provide a healthy stay for the children. Qualified and experienced nurses look after the infirmary and a doctor visits regularly. The school also maintains special arrangement with a nearby multi speciality hospital. Regular check ups are conducted to look after the general well being of the students, and parents are regularly informed about the health of their wards.

The parents are also requested to keep the school informed about all medical reports of the child, regarding allergies to any substances, treatments, if any, going





on, to keep the school records updated. A medical form will be sent to parents before every vacation which must be completed and returned at the start of each term. A routine checkup must be done of teeth, eyes, ears, nose and throat during the vacations.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES & HOBBIES

It is very important to offer rich co-curricular activities to students of all ages. It is only through this exposure that a child becomes aware of his/her special interests and talents. This in turn allows a child to receive appreciation and grow with confidence. This confidence then gets reflected in other areas leading to all round growth and progress. Our co-curricular activities include hobbies, publications, special interest clubs including community service. The nature and range of these activities are not static and continue to evolve as per the interests and talents of the student. The co-curricular activities offered include clubs and societies for English & Hindi debating, creative writing, recitation, etiquette, quiz, chess, nature preservation and so on. Publication includes an annual school magazine 'Sanskar'. Community service includes visits to an old age home educating the community on waste management, campus and township cleanliness and specific projects for the community at large.

GENERAL SUPPLY HOUSE

The General Supply House caters to the demands of the students on day to day basis.

THE ARYAN OLD STUDENT ASSOCIATION (TAOSA)

All students who have passed out of The Aryan School are given life long membership of TAOSA as per the membership fee which is deducted from the security deposit. This association is a reflection of The Aryans who are ambassadors of The Aryan School in different fields. We always want to keep in touch with our Alumni. Letters that they write to us will be printed in the school magazine. They will always be sent invitations for Founders Day & Gala Fete.

We wish to keep the memories of the school alive in their hearts.













HOSTEL FACILITIES AND RULES

The school has state of the art boarding house in separate buildings for girls, junior boys and senior boys equipped with all modern amenities and facilities. The hostel block features individual and collective space for rest and study. It is designed to provide each child with a feeling of security and comfort. The rooms are airy and washrooms scrupulously clean with hot and cold water running.

Food

Vegetarian and Non Vegetarian food is provided to the students. The menu includes Indian, Continental and Chinese cuisine. Milk is served twice daily. The weekly menu keeps changing to avoid monotony. The food committee consisting of senior children, makes the menu. To keep pupils in good health, the Mess Managers supervise all kitchen operations. The residential staff eats along with the children.

Health and Care

The school takes special care of the students' health and has on its panel specialized and competent doctors. The school hostel has competent staff consisting of matrons, housemasters and trained nurses who live on the campus. Parents are informed of the child's health if he/she is confined to bed for more than three days. In case of emergency, the Principal reserves the right to use his/her discretion to authorize required medical treatment and the use of anesthesia in the interest of the child's health. The school has an arrangement with a reputed hospital very close by, to cater for emergencies.

Visiting Hours

The boarders are allowed Sunday outings according to the schedule given in the school calendar. Parents/Guardians are requested to take the children out only on outing days and adhere to the timings. No parents will be allowed inside the campus to meet their child/ward without the permission of the Principal. In case of an emergency, the parents are requested to contact either the Principal or the House Master. No eatables of any nature from outside are allowed in the campus.

Transport Arrangement

The school arranges to drop the boarders at the end of term till New Delhi and the airport. The school makes transport arrangement for this purpose with an escort to the airport. They are also received on arrival after holidays provided there are sufficient students and an advance notice of two weeks is given to the school.

Mid Term

Excursions are compulsory in the mid term break, when children are sent for age appropriate expedition with staff. Children are taught survival skills and respect for nature. Adventure activities are provided on weekends.









GENERAL INFORMATION

Registration

A newspaper advertisement announcing the availability of seats may, at the discretion of the Principal, be released three to four months before the academic year is scheduled to commence. Prospective parents are welcome to visit the school on any working day during office hours i.e. 9 A.M – 5 P.M and may register their child for admission to a particular class. A non-refundable registration fee to be determined and reviewed periodically by the Board of Governors, will be charged from the candidate applying for registration on the prescribed registration form. The mere act of registration will not constitute a guarantee of admission, which is subject to assessment, interview and the rules contained there in. All candidates will be required to register, following the registration procedure outlined above and only registered candidates will be eligible for assessment.

Admission in Class XI

A child may be admitted provisionally in April in one of the three streams i.e. Humanities, Science & Commerce with or without Mathematics. The admission and subjects are confirmed only after the board results are declared at the end of May. The School will admit those candidates whose class X results are declared before 31st July of the academic year. Candidates seeking admission to class XI of the ISC (XII) course, who have passed their class X Examination from the National Institute of Open Schooling, New Delhi, must fulfill the following criteria:-

- a. Pass in five written subjects of external examination
- b. These five subjects must include English, a second language and three other written subjects accepted by the Council.
- c. Pass the examination in one attempt.

Procedure

Candidates who are offered admission must avail of the offer within the specified time by paying the necessary admission fees, as defined in the current year's Fee structure and returning duly signed the Indemnity Agreement (on Judicial Stamp Paper), the Uniform measurement chart and the Student's medical history form, T.C. and Report Card of previous school and 5 Passport size photographs failing which the admission may not be granted. In such cases, the school will be entitled to offer the place to the next eligible candidate in order of merit/position in the waiting list. On full payment of the admission charges and submission of the relevant documents, candidates will be sent an Admission Document,





allotted an admission number placed on the school rolls. Once admitted, candidates will be subject to all the rules and regulations of the school. Admission charges once paid will not be refunded under any circumstance.

Security

Security Deposited amount is refundable and will be refunded one year after the withdrawal of the child on a written request from the Parent/Guardian. The refund of the security deposit is subject to the clearance of the dues. Security Deposit will not be adjusted against the pending dues. At the time of claiming the refund of security deposit, the parent/guardian must produce the original receipt of Deposit of Caution Money.

Fees & Fines

The child will not be permitted to attend class and no Transfer Certificate will be issued unless all dues are cleared along with the fine. Fees will be charged for the whole duration, irrespective of the child's attendance. No reduction of fees will be made on account of any holiday/forced closure or temporary absence. A student joining the session or the hostel late despite being admitted will have to pay all charges of the term. There will be no reduction of fees on grounds of absence of the student. The child will not be allowed to join the new term until all the dues for the previous term are cleared. The school will give the parents two bills in order to keep the parents informed of the students' account status. Miscellaneous expenses such as for Founder's Day, Extra curricular activities, Annual magazine, Examinations, Inter school & Inter State Participation will be charged on actual bills. All charges deducted against Imprest Money are charged on actual and each bill is counter signed by the child, if you require any details, it must be sent in writing to the Accounts section and they will be posted to you within 15 days.





THE ACADEMIC PROGRAMME

The Academic Programme

At the Aryan School, the child is the center of the world and all activities are arranged around the child. The school programme is designed to inculcate global thinking in the children and at the same time strengthening their cultural roots. A meaningful vibrant education pattern is followed, laying emphasis on self directed learning, letting the teacher play the role of a facilitator. A broad curriculum of subjects ensures wide exposure to the children, where as a range of activities engage the child, honing the personality and character. The school is from class L.K.G. to XII. The school's Academic programme is from April to March, divided into two terms.

Activity Based Learning

One of the important aspects of a truly good education, particularly at the primary & middle school level, is that learning must be activity oriented, with plenty of practical work and provision for concrete learning experience, rather than mere bookish learning. Therefore all academics facility and interiors have been meticulously planned to allow plenty of individual activities and project work.

Third Language

Three periods per week in a third language acceptable to the Examination Board are compulsory from standards V to VIII.

Counseling

All children want to get the most out of their course and life at school. But there may be times when other concerns or problems interfere with that aim. Arrangements have been made to offer personalized counseling to children should they feel the need, as talking to solve the issues at such times can often help identify and resolve matters to enable the students in making judicious selection suitable to their personal aptitudes in career opportunities.

Subject Choices

In Class XI, the child may opt for Humanities, Science or Commerce stream. Subjects offered in Humanities are Economics, History, Psychology or Political Science, Optional and English. Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics or Biology, Optional and English are the subjects offered in Science whereas English, Accounts, Commerce, Economics or Mathematics, and Optional are offered in the Commerce stream. Optional subjects are Computers, Art, Fashion Designing and Home Science.

SPORTS AND HOBBIES

To develop a healthy mind in a healthy body, the school lays particular stress on extra and co-curricular activities. Every child is required to be involved in a variety of activities necessary for his/her all-round development. The school has excellent facilities for sports and games such as Football, Hockey, Cricket, Badminton, Table Tennis, Yoga, Athletics, Swimming, Basketball, Shooting, Lawn Tennis, Karate, etc. The school also has various clubs-theatre, debate, nature walk, social service, music, art & craft and adventure.

Regular Inter-House activities are organized to develop a competitive spirit in the children and to bring out the best in them. Regular trips are planned to enhance and extend classroom learning. This allows the students to discover their own sense of individuality and creativity.

The school has a well-stocked library complete with books not only relating to the course material but also of all subjects ranging from general knowledge to science, fiction, astronomy, religion, sports etc. The school library is a place for students where they can all pursue their intellectual pursuits without submitting to any regime, or conventional classroom methods of instruction.

The library is also connected via the Internet to all the major libraries of the world, this allows the students to pursue his/her interest and enquiry. Apart from these, Science Laboratories, Computer Lab, Art & Craft, are the facilities to promote practical learning.







SCHEDULE FOR DAY BOARDERS

Students have extended hours of stay in the school after 2:00 p.m. Day Boarding facility is provided where the children are exposed to plethora of activities besides academics. This is a platform for the children, while accomplishing their goals they learn to be independent and acquire skills in different fields. Students at Day Boarding are put in a separate hostel where they are provided with individual cupboards and beds. A balanced and nutritious diet is prepared under hygienic conditions for lunch. Children like to take a nap after lunch. Games are an integral part of their daily schedule. On Saturday and Sunday the children pursue a hobby of their choice. Day boarders are participants of most of the cocurricular activities. Like Inter House and Inter School activities and sports. The daily schedule of the day boarding students is as follows:
